APPLICATION PROCEDURE

Pre-formed quartets and individual instrumentalists are encouraged to apply.

Both applications (UMKC and Conservatory) and all supplemental materials must be received by December 15, 2017.

All applicants will be pre-screened via video recordings uploaded to the Conservatory application. Live auditions for quartets and individuals will be scheduled after finalists are selected.

Applying as a quartet:

All quartet members must apply to the Conservatory. In addition, one member of the quartet will need to submit the following additional information through their Conservatory application:

- Resume/history of the quartet (include name of quartet and names of all members)
- Video recording of the group (2 contrasting works, up to 40 minutes total)
- These should be uploaded to one quartet member's Conservatory application

Applying as an individual:

Individual applicants should complete the standard application process based on the respective degree requirements. Uploaded video recordings should include a sample of the applicant's chamber music playing.
